

# Work in Portugal 2022 | Learning Portuguese











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#### Who can attend PLA courses?

- Citizens aged 16 or over
- Whose native language is not Portuguese and/or who do not have basic, intermediate or advanced skills in Portuguese language

### What do I have to present?

- Residence permit or visa (short term for seasonal work, temporary stay or residence)
- or
- Proof of initiation of the regularization procedure from the Portuguese Immigration and Borders Service (SEF)
- or
- Social Security Number (NISS)



### • Where can I apply?

- Public schools
- Employment and Vocational Training Centres (Employment and Vocational Training Institute – IEFP, I.P.)
- Qualifica Centres

#### Who teaches PLA courses?

- Professional teachers in teaching Portuguese
- Trainers with specific training







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#### How are PLA courses organised?

- According to the competences and training referential included in the National Qualifications Catalogue (CNQ)
- Level A1 + A2 Elementary User (150h)
- Level B1 + B2 Independent User (150h)
- Specific Short Training Unit Graphical dimension and alphabet in Portuguese for users of other writing systems (25h)
- Minimum number: 15 | Maximum number: 20
- Flexible timetables
- Face-to-face or online
- Cost-free (mostly)



## **Portuguese Host Language (PLA) courses**

- Are PLA courses certified?
  - PLA courses are certified
  - A2 level certification or higher
- → Requesting Portuguese nationality
- $\rightarrow$  Granting permanent residency
- → Granting long-term resident status

### Online Platform for Portuguese

- <u>https://pptonline.acm.gov.pt/</u>
- Free access
- Does not confer certification
- Two levels level A and level B
- 24 functional thematic modules (text, audio, video and image formats)
- Languages: Portuguese, English, Arabic and Spanish
- 65.427 registered users (between 2016 and 31 October 2022)
- New version (coming soon)
