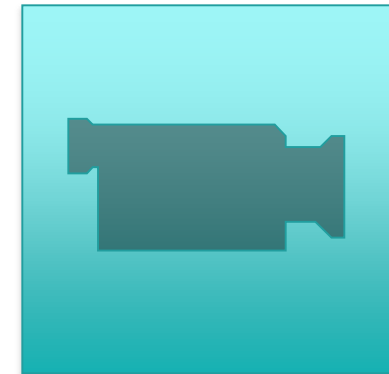

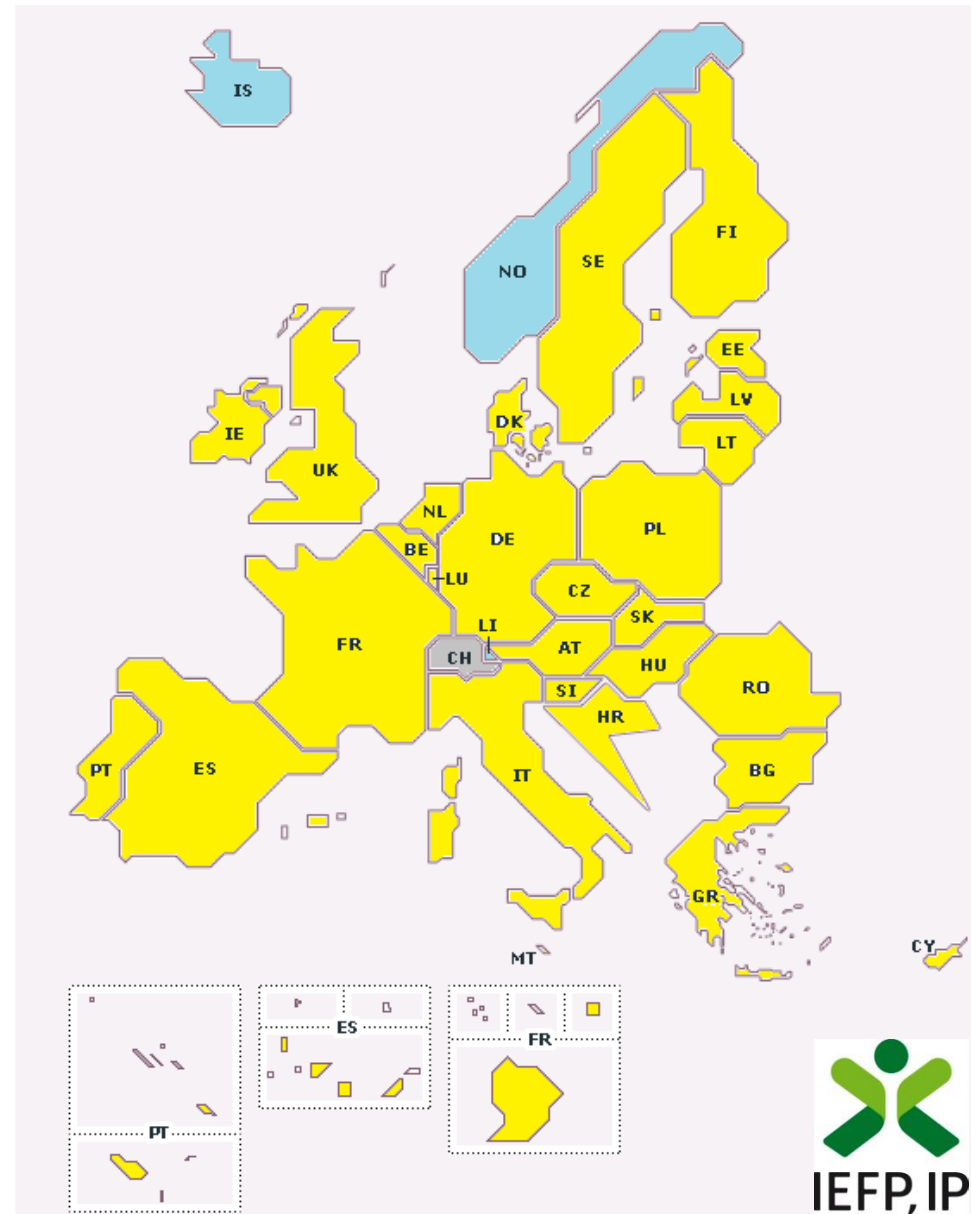

The purpose of EURES is to provide information, advice and recruitment/placement (job-matching) services for the benefit of workers and employers as well as any citizen wishing to benefit from the principle of the free movement of persons.

EURES is much more than the Job Mobility Portal that you are visiting right now.

EURES has a human network of more than 850 EURES advisers that are in daily contact with jobseekers and employers across Europe.

In European cross-border regions, EURES has an important role to play in providing information about and helping to solve all sorts of problems related to cross-border commuting that workers and employers may experience.

Set up in 1993, EURES is a co-operation network between the European Commission and the Public Employment Services of the EEA Member States (The EU countries plus Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein) and other partner organisations. Switzerland also takes part in EURES co-operation. The joint

Living & Working ?

In order to be able to make informed decisions about mobility, job-seekers and employers need information on a wide range of practical, legal and administrative questions. The EURES Job Mobility Portal provides information tools which aim to give help and support when considering moving to or recruiting from another country.

The Living and Working Conditions database contains details on a number of important issues such as finding accommodation, finding a school, taxes, cost of living, health, social legislation, comparability of qualifications, etc.

Another valuable information tool is the Labour Market Information section, containing information on current trends on the European labour market by country, region and sector of activity. Study abroad

Living and studying in a foreign country is the best way to gain in-depth knowledge of another culture's customs, people, and language. In addition, living and studying or working in another country can develop important transnational competences that may be of interest to future employers.

Students who return from a programme of study abroad often see it as an experience which matured them personally and intellectually. They appreciate being exposed to new ways of thinking and living, which encourages personal development and self-reliance.

Study abroad can do more than encourage academic enrichment and personal development; it also can enhance employment prospects. Employers are increasingly seeking people who have experience of other countries, since they are likely to possess, apart from language skills, cross-cultural communication skills, an understanding of and familiarity with local customs and cultural contexts, flexibility, resilience, and the ability to adapt to new circumstances and deal constructively with different points of view.

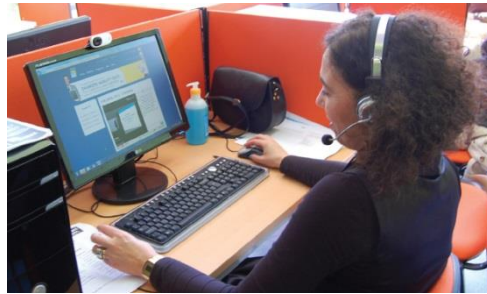

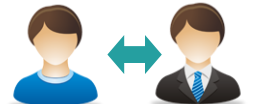

- Inviting candidates to attend job interviews
- Schedule job interviews based on available timeslots
- Timeslots Management



What you should consider

- Identify where you want to live and work abroad
- Research the norms and conditions of your next location
- Create your own adapting plan
- Check what stands out in terms of culture in the host country
- Build language skills
- Get familiar with the country's tax code
- Confirm if your profession is regulated in your new home country - PNRQ)
- If it is, check how to apply for your qualifications to be recognized
- Compare the cost of living – how far will your salary go
- Save some additional money (you will need it before you get your salary) paid
- Get a moment for self reflection (thoughts, goals, motivations, eventual frustrations)

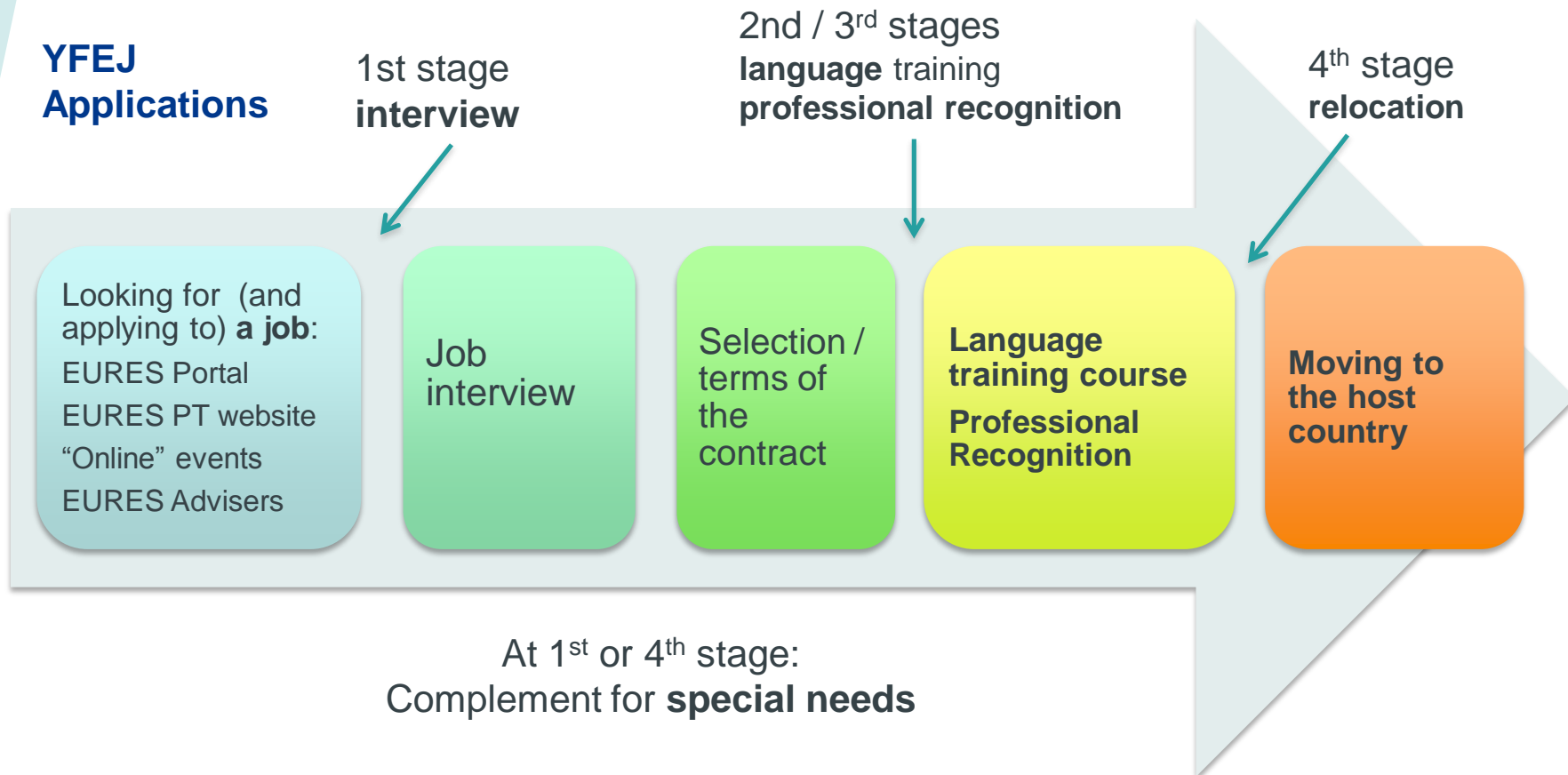

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- **Important documents** – be sure to request official copies of important personal documents and allow some weeks to receive them
- **Bank and credit card accounts** - review your accounts and notify your banks you will be living abroad. Consider online international banking to make any contact easier
- **Health Insurance** - while not covered by your new country's healthcare system, search for individual policies to protect you
- **International Driving Permit (IDP)** – remember to carry your IDP and your Portuguese driver's license with you at all times
- **Your new country's rules** - regulations and laws vary widely among countries

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

Key points to consider when signing a contract:

- **Employment terms** (job description, hours of work, place of work, bonus entitlement, overtime)
- **Salary** – in what currency will you be paid (bear in mind variation of currency may work for or against you / compare with the cost of living)
- **Local taxes** – what deductions to be made from your salary
- **Mandatory notices to the employer** – your obligations if you want to quit before the term of the contract
- **Benefits** – accommodation, medical insurance, transport

SIGNING THE CONTRACT

Only if you are fully happy with the terms and conditions on offer and have ensured any verbal amendments have been written into the contract.

ARRIVING...

Immerse yourself in the local culture, people and food and enjoy it.

Stay curious and connected – you will become bigger, richer and more inspiring.

Embrace the new language as soon as you arrive and use every opportunity to practise it.

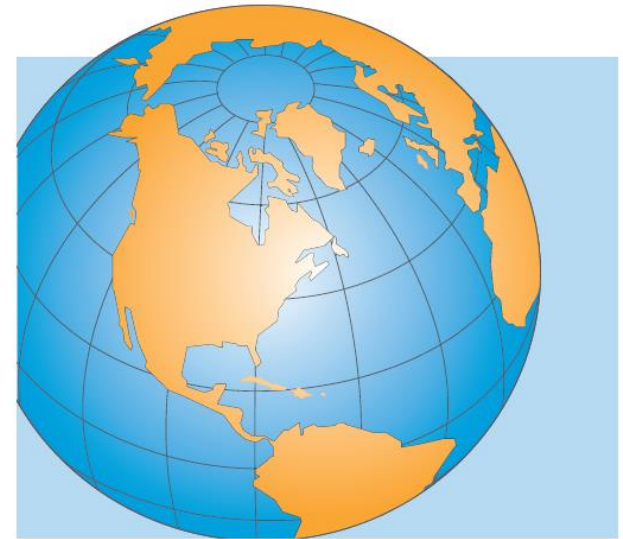
