DRIVING IN ITALY

Holders of driving licences issued by an EU Member State can drive in Italy (only the category of vehicle for which their licence is valid). It is however advisable to apply for the conversion or the recognition of validity in order to facilitate procedures regarding renewal or duplicate licence.

During the conversion procedure the original licence is substituted with an Italian licence.







- With the recognition of validity the driver keeps the original licence.
- If you are living and driving in Italy for more than 6 months it is necessary to register the vehicle and pay the registration fee to the competent local authorities.
- Car insurance is valid throughout Europe.







Standard format

- Since 2013, all driving licences issued in the EU have a standard format a plastic, credit card-sized photocard, with better security features.
- You can still use your old-style licence, but it will be changed to the new format when you renew it (or at the latest by 2033).
- Driving licenses licences issued by an EU Member State or EEA are equivalent to Italian licenses.







Standard format

The holder of a EU driving license with administrative validity in accordance with that established in art. 7 paragraph 2 of Directive 2006/126 / EEC can circulate with its own document, until the expiry date; upon expiry of the period of validity, he / she addresses (personally or through a delegate) to the Department of Motor Vehicles and requests the conversion of the foreign driving license, which obviously must be withdrawn and returned to the competent Authorities, as usual.







- The conversion can also be requested before the administrative validity of the EU driving license expires.
- In this case, the driver can choose whether to attribute to the Italian driving license or the residual period of validity, therefore not presenting the medical certificate relating to the confirmation of validity of the category requested in conversion, or whether to obtain a new period of validity, thus attaching to the application the medical certificate required.







- Foreign citizens residing in Italy can circulate with their driving license for 1 year if non-EU citizens and for 2 years if European citizens.
- After this deadline they must convert the foreign driving license into an Italian driving license. If they do not, the license can be withdrawn by the police.







The holder of an EU or SSE driving license acquired residence in Italy:

- He must convert it (which consists in the issue of a new Italian license corresponding to the foreign one) after 2 years from residence if the license is "without limits" of administrative validity (this provision has been in force since January 19, 2013 - Prot. No. 6946 of March 26, 2014).
- It must convert it before the revision ordered by the owner.
- However, citizens holding a driving license issued by a Member State who acquire residence
 in Italy must comply with the Italian provisions regarding the duration of validity of the license
 and medical supervision. To determine the expiration date of the Community driving license,
 it is necessary to refer to the day on which the holder acquired residence in Italy by
 calculating the expiration according to the age of the driver and the category of license held.







The full translation of the driving license can be done by:

- a) translator and certified with an oath taken before a judicial chancellor or notary (N.B. by translator is meant anyone who is able to carry out a faithful and complete translation of the foreign text);
- b) Consulate with signature of the consular officers legalized in the Prefecture.







- Lost or stolen driving licence
- If your driving licence is lost or stolen while you are travelling abroad, contact the local police and your consulate or embassy to report the matter.
- Your consulate will contact the national authorities that issued your driving licence (to check it was not restricted, suspended, cancelled or revoked).
- On the basis of the information received from the consulate, the police may then issue
 a provisional document that allows you to drive in that country for a limited period of time.
- You can only apply for a replacement driving licence in the country where you have your usual residence.
- Provisional licences and certificates issued to temporarily replace lost or stolen licences are not automatically recognised in other EU countries.

- Car insurance validity
- Your car insurance policy issued in home country covers you throughout the EU if you injure someone?
- Find out more information about national regulations concerning insurance cover when travelling abroad.
- Your car's number plate is proof that you have liability insurance. This means that police
 in another country will not normally stop you to check if you are insured. If you travel with a
 trailer, it needs to be insured too. In some EU countries you must have separate insurance
 for a trailer. Check with your insurer before you travel.
- Always take your insurance papers with you. It may make things easier if you have an accident or are stopped by the police.
