#### 1 PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Job Centers (Centri per l'impiego – CPI) are public structures located throughout the country and coordinated by the Regions or Autonomous Provinces.

They provide guidance and advisory services and facilitate the matching of labour supply and demand.

Each Italian region has a regional portal to keep users updated on job opportunities and new regulations in their respective territories.

**ANPAL** Agenzia Nazionale Politiche Attive Lavoro – ANPAL is the National Agency for Active Employment Policies. On its portal you can find news and information about the world of work and careers.

Job offers from all over Italy are published on the MyAnpal platform.

To consult and apply for job offers you need to register through the <u>SPID</u> (Public Digital Identity System).







#### 1 PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

The **EURES** service is available at each CPI, providing information on vacancies in the European Economic Area and guidance and advice on living and working conditions in the various European countries.



EURES organises regular job fairs in many countries and online.

#### **2 EMPLOYMENT AGENCIES**











In Italy there are more than 4000 Employment Agencies: they are private operators authorized by ANPAL to offer matching services between job supply and demand.

# HOW TO FIND A JOB in Italy 4 SOCIAL NETWORKS AND WEBSITES

Some websites are dedicated to match labour supply and demand in **agriculture**. They include:

- Lavora con agricoltori italiani -"Working with Italian farmers" a modern job portal that helps applicants searching farming jobs











**5 DIRECT CONTACT WITH A COMPANY** 

If you are interested in working at a specific company, it may be a good idea to apply for a job with them directly. Many companies include information on available positions on their websites. If you don't find career information on a company's website, you can contact them directly to ask if they can accept an open application or you can send a speculative application to let them know about your skills.







#### **6 NETWORKING**

Last but not least, NETWORKING is a great way to find work in Italy because most vacancies are filled informally. Personal networks and existing contacts from work or school also provide a considerable number of opportunities, so try to cultivate personal contacts in sectors you are interested in.
