**Do you plan to do a work experience
for this summer in Italy?**



If you are thinking about a job in Italy or Europe, there are at least 5 good reasons to consider seasonal work:

- 1- Seasonal jobs could be a great way to start living and working in another European country*
- 2 - Seasonal jobs could be a great way to increase your skills*
- 3 - As a seasonal worker you are entitled to the same working conditions as national workers*
- 4 - Seasonal work is your first step to further job opportunities*
- 5 - Seasonal work allows you to develop a wider range of professional contacts*



Seasonal work can be a job opportunity for those looking for a job for a fixed term or in any case for a short period; often has as its objective the main one is to offer young people a first work experience, not necessarily professionalizing or linked to one's own course of study and, if carried out abroad, can be a good opportunity to improve the language and learn about ways of life other than your own.



The best time to find a seasonal job in marine areas is summer; while in the mountains, in the winter sports resorts of the northern and central regions, in addition to summer the season is from November to March. In the cities of art there are good opportunities also during the Easter and Christmas holidays.

For seasonal work, the type of contract most frequently applied is that of the fixed term that the employer uses to cope with seasonal peaks of work, that is, an increase in extraordinary and occasional activities that occur in some sectors (Tourism, Trade and Agriculture) and at certain times of the year.



Definition: Seasonal Jobs

A seasonal job is a short-term position designed to fill a temporary need, usually related to the time of year.

One of the defining characteristics of a seasonal job is that it is temporary — employers hire seasonal staff to fill a particular need that is not expected to last more than a few weeks or months. The timeline is usually set out at beginning so that employees are not surprised when the work ends.

Seasonal jobs include most trades in hotels and restaurants, couriers and travel company representatives, a variety of jobs in ski resorts, sports instructors, jobs in bars and clubs, fruit and grape picking, and various jobs in the construction industry.



Seasonal / Summer jobs (*lavoro stagionale*) in Italy

Inquiring, documenting, orienting oneself is one of the main objectives for achieving full autonomy in the world of work.

The focus on "Seasonal Work" seeks to meet the information needs of those who aspire to achieve a short work experience in Italy, mainly during summer holidays, aimed at learning or improving the knowledge of a foreign language.



Seasonal / Summer jobs (*lavoro stagionale*) in Italy

If you aren't an EU national, it's essential to check whether you're eligible to work in Italy before making plans and you may also be required to obtain a visa.

Check with an Italian embassy or consulate in your home country well in advance of your Quota Agreement "decreto-flussi"

Seasonal work is work not available throughout the year, but rather during a specific limited period or during a specific season. Therefore, the entry of a foreign worker to Italy with a view to engaging in a seasonal work is available for some sectors of work only. These sectors are specific to:

The main seasonal jobs available in Italy:

Ski Resorts

Require an army of temporary workers to cater for the annual invasion of winter sports enthusiasts. As well as the jobs in the hotel and catering trades already mentioned above, a variety of other jobs are available, including resort representatives, chalet girls, ski technicians, ski instructors and guides. As a general rule, the better paid the job, the longer the working hours and the less time there is for skiing

The main seasonal jobs available in Italy:

Sports Instructors

Are required for a variety of sports, including badminton, canoeing, diving, golf, gymnastics, hang-gliding, horse riding, mountaineering, parachuting, rock-climbing, sailing, squash, sub-aquatic sports, swimming, tennis and windsurfing. Whatever the sport, it's probably played and taught somewhere in Italy. Most jobs for are available in the summer months. If you're a qualified winter sports instructor, you should contact Italian ski resorts

The main seasonal jobs available in Italy:

Hotels & Catering

Hotels and restaurants are the largest employers of seasonal workers, from hotel managers to kitchen hands, with jobs which are available all year round. Experience, qualifications and fluent Italian are required for all the best and highest paid positions, although a variety of jobs are available for the untrained and inexperienced.

The main seasonal jobs available in Italy:

Holiday Company Representatives

The duties of holiday representatives include ferrying tourist groups back and forth from airports, organising excursions and social events, arranging ski passes and equipment rental, and generally playing the role of Jack of all trades.

Some companies operate both summer and winter hotels and camps throughout Italy. Employees are required to speak good Italian.

Representatives are also required for summer camps, which are organised for both adults and children.

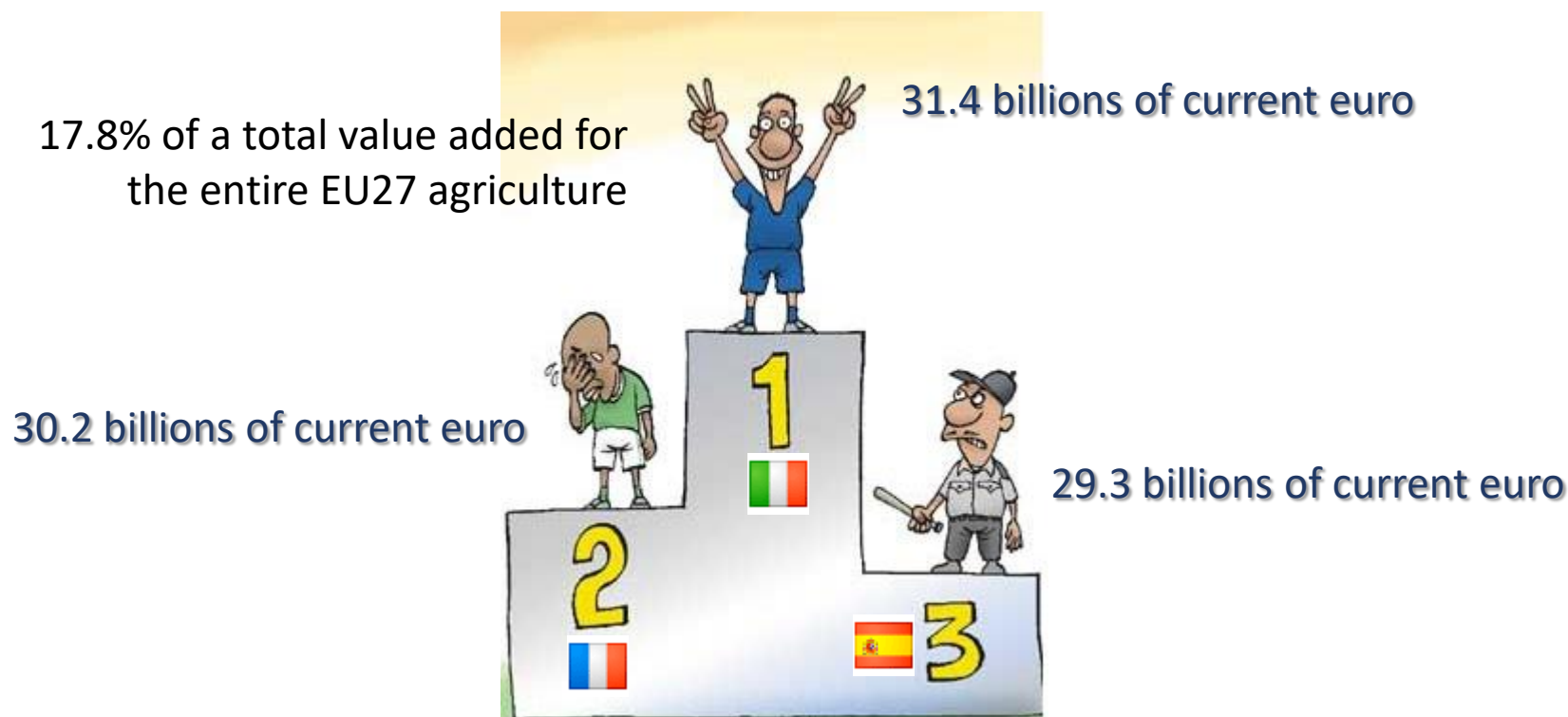

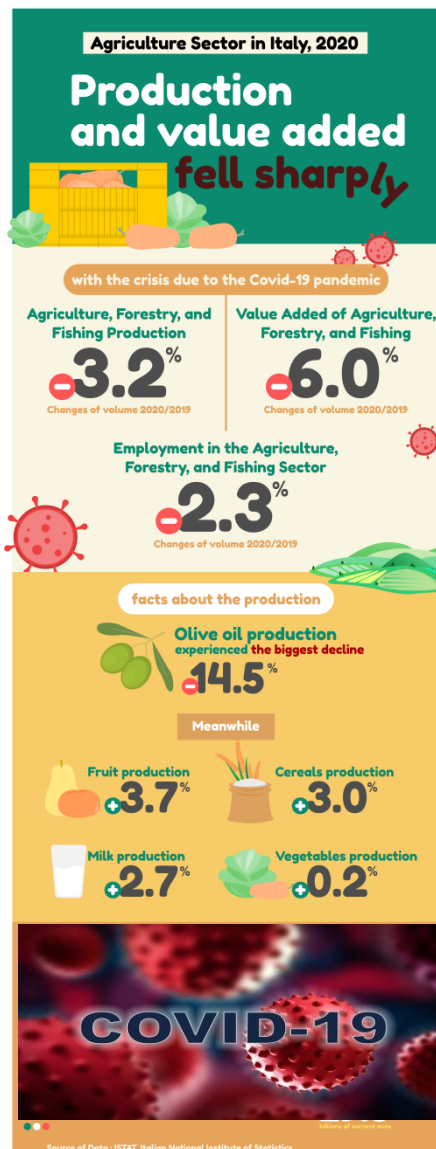
Grape & Fruit Picking

To find a fruit or vegetable picking job, visit the local information centre, which will provide you with a list of farms in the area taking on temporary workers for the harvest season. Local employment offices (*Centri per Impiego*) and agricultural co-operatives may also be helpful, although it's generally best to contact farms directly.

TRENDS IN THE AGRICULTURAL ECONOMY

In the EU27, production (-0.8%) and agricultural income (-1.5%) fall. Italy remains the leading European country in terms of value added and the third in terms of value of production.





TRENDS IN THE AGRICULTURAL ECONOMY

Production and value added fell sharply, secondary activities collapse

In 2020 agricultural production decreased in volume by 3.2% and value added by 6%; employment also dropped significantly (-2.3%).

The production of olive oil has suffered the greatest downsizing (-14.5%) while the production of fruit (+3.7%), cereals (+3%), milk (+2.7%) and vegetables (+0.2%) increased.

The effects of the Covid-19 health emergency have affected secondary activities (-20.3%), the horticultural sector (-8.4%) and agricultural support services (-4.1%).

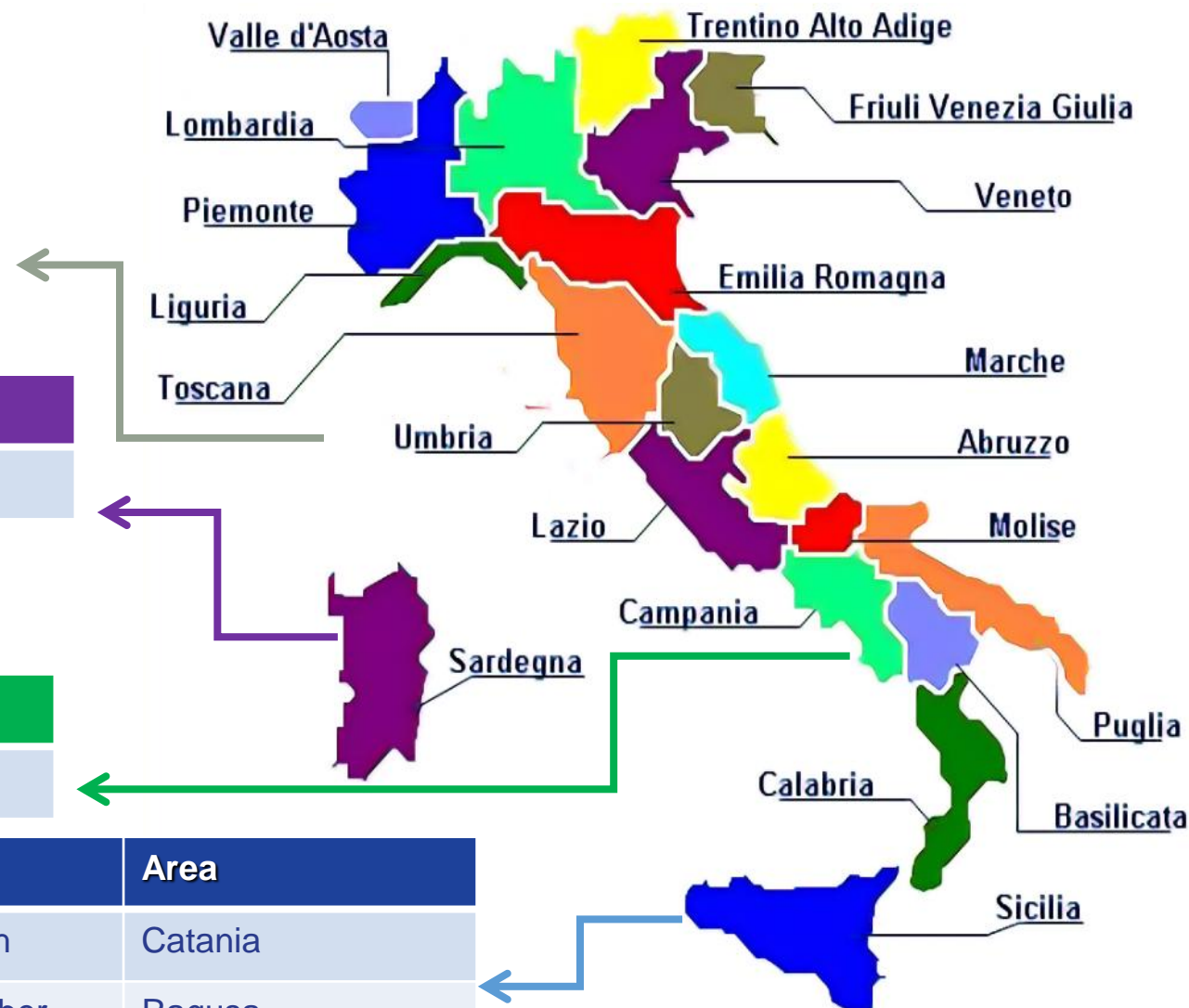
