



RIGHT OF RESIDENCE (1)

Entry and residence in Romania of EU/EEA/Swiss Confederation citizens and their family members

- EU/EEA/Swiss Confederation citizens can enter Romania if they present a valid national identity document, passport or other document that certifies identity and is recognized by the Romanian state.

RIGHT OF RESIDENCE (2)

Citizens who want to stay more than 3 months in Romania must register their residence at the General Inspectorate for Immigration (IGI) territorial formations in the county where they live.

Depending on the purpose of the stay in Romania, the documents issued by IGI can be:

- the registration certificate (for EU/EEA/Swiss Confederation citizens),
- the residence card (for family members of EU/EEA/Swiss Confederation citizens),
- the permanent residence card (both for EU/EEA/Swiss Confederation citizens and their family members).



- In 2024, the employment rate of working age population 20-64 years: 69.5% (EU 75.8%)
- Registered unemployment rate at 31.08.2025: 3,2% (PES calculation)
- Nr. of registered unemployed: 253,7 thousand persons out of which:
- 53% men, 47% women; 73% in rural areas
- 40% long term adults unemployed


Registered unemployment at national level

Age groups




Education level

GROWING SECTORS AND MARKETS NEEDS

- **CONSTRUCTIONS** - construction workers, welders, electricians, blacksmiths, practically the entire range of professions
- **HOSPITALITY** - waiters, bartenders, cooks, chefs

Brief description of the labor market in Romania

- Romania's active population is aging, has decreased by approximately 3% in the last five years, and the birth rate continues to be one of the lowest in the European Union
- Migration of qualified workers
- Decreasing of young people on the labor market
- Lack of investment in workforce development
- The demand for qualified and highly qualified labor is in growth
- Given the aging population, the active integration of people over 50 years old into the labor market is essential
- By 2030, the local labor market will need more than 600.000 people to fill skilled and highly skilled jobs in Romania

Recruitment challenges

The Romanian labour market proves the same challenges as the other member states from EU in the fields of both, professions and sectors.

Our labor market is facing a personnel crisis, especially in sectors such as IT, construction, qualified workers, engineers, technicians, health and care staff and agriculture.

The number of third country nationals is in continuing growth on Romanian labour market in order to fulfill job vacancies.

Recruitment challenges

Romania has been importing more and more workforce in recent years, especially from Asia.

At the end of 2024, over 140.640 employees from outside the EU were registered as legally working in Romania (General Inspectorate for Immigration - IGI).

The industries in which they operate are:

- production (29.141 employees)
- construction (28.538)
- trade (20.008)
- HoReCa (18.844)
- administrative and support services (12.189)

TCN migration in Romania

In 2025- quota of TCN newly admitted on Romanian labour market: 100.000

January-August 2025, almost 67,000 employment permits have been issued by GII, mainly for workers not qualified, in HORECA, constructions, services:

Non-EU citizens have the right to work in Romania, only on the basis of a work permit, issued by the IGI.

EMPLOYMENT

EU/EEA/Swiss Confederation citizens looking for a job have free access to the Romanian labor market and the employment is done under the same conditions as the employment of a Romanian citizen.

WORK TIME AND REST TIME

The normal length of working time for full time is 8 hours per day and 40 hours per week. The maximum duration of working time cannot exceed 48 hours per week, including overtime.

Paid annual leave is guaranteed to all employees, the minimum duration of annual leave is 20 working days.

THE SALARY

- since 01.01.2025, the national minimum wage is RON 4.050 (approx. EUR 810), respectively RON 2.576 net (approx. EUR 515)

On the date of 31.07.2025 :

- the national average gross salary was RON 8.910 (approximately EUR 1.782);
- the national average net salary was RON 5.328 (approximately EUR 1.065).
- The highest average net salary values were recorded:
 - in computer service activities (LEI 11.437 – EUR 2.287) and in the manufacture of coke oven products and products obtained from crude oil processing (LEI 10.877 – EUR 2.175);

The lowest average net salary values were recorded:

- in clothing manufacturing (LEI 3.292 – EUR 658) and in hotels and restaurants (LEI 3.321 - EUR 664).

SOCIAL SECURITY CONTRIBUTIONS

There are three compulsory social contributions, as follows:

- **The social contribution (for pension fund):**
 - 25 - 32% of the gross monthly income for normal/abnormal/special working conditions, due by the employee, of which 3.75 % is assigned to the private pension fund;
- **Health contribution**
 - 10 % of the employee's gross monthly income, due by the employee
- **Work accidents**
 - 2.25 % of the gross monthly income, due by the employer, which includes the unemployment insurance contributions, the contribution for sick leave, the contribution for occupational risks and the contribution to salary claims.

The income tax deducted for any gross salary is 10%. Social contributions and income tax are calculated, retained and paid by the employer.

RECOGNITION OF DIPLOMAS, PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE AND QUALIFICATIONS OBTAINED ABROAD

Recognition / equivalence of study diplomas

For the recognition of baccalaureate, university or post-graduate diplomas acquired by European citizens, for regulated occupations, as well as for the recognition of qualifications, citizens must send an application, together with the supporting documents, to the **National Center for the Recognition and Equivalence of Diplomas (CNRED)** - an institution operating within Ministry of National Education.



Diplomas and certificates of full and partial studies are automatically recognized if they are obtained from accredited educational institutions in the EU, EEA and the Swiss Confederation.

HEALTHCARE SYSTEM

Regarding health and medical care, foreign citizens benefit from the coverage of medical services provided on the territory of Romania, under the conditions provided by the agreements, understandings, conventions or protocols concluded between Romania and the respective country.

Once the foreign citizens are employed they pay the taxes and are ***insured in the public health insurance system.***

For a temporary stay, of a maximum of 6 months, citizens of the EU/EEA member states are entitled to medical benefits if they present a valid European Health Insurance Card.

Renting a Home

If you're looking to rent an apartment, it's advisable to consult the real estate market section of newspapers, whether in print or online. You can also contact a real estate agency.

The rent depends on the size of the apartment, its location, and its amenities (furniture, appliances). The average rent for a studio apartment (one room apartment) in major cities range from EUR 350 (in Iași) to EUR 400 (in Bucharest and Cluj).

For two-room apartments, the average rent ranges from EUR 500 (in Iași) to EUR 650 (in Cluj-Napoca), while for three-room apartments, the average rent ranges from EUR 600 (in Iași) to EUR 900 (in Bucharest and Cluj).

As a rule, the rent does not include utilities (electricity, gas, water, heating, telephone, etc) which have to be separately paid by the tenant.

Cost of living

While the VAT rate for most goods and services provided by Romanian companies is 21%, there are goods and services for which the VAT is 11% (e.g., for medicines for human and veterinary use, prosthetics and accessories, the distribution of drinking and irrigation water, school textbooks, magazines, publications in general, participation in sporting events, cultural events, etc.)

Approximate prices for some basic products:

EUR 2 for a 250g block of butter,
EUR 1.7 for 1 litre of milk,
EUR 1.9 for 1 kg of rice,
EUR 0.8 for 1 kg of potatoes,
EUR 1.6 for a 0.5 kg loaf of white bread,
EUR 1.6 for 1 litre of cooking oil,
EUR 1.5-2 for an espresso,
EUR 1.7 for 1 litre of gasoline.
